Celebration of Life Seeds of Potential

Overview

The group will create and decorate containers for plants, using recycled food tins with holes punctured in the bottom; and decorated with sea shells, beads, mosaics and tiles that they will attach to the tins with white grout.

We will grow plants from beans, caring for them with regular watering and placing them in a warm, sunny place at the Butterfly Art Project's Art Centre in Vrygrond. The children will witness the changes that take place once the seeds are activated and nurtured; and connect with their agency in awakening the latent potential in the dormant seeds.

They will also become familiar with the qualities and the vocabulary of the materials; and be able to relate with new understanding to the mosaic embellishments present in their ACV environment. At the end of the project, they will plant their new plants in the transformed tins.




